Simulator Golf-Tom Martini

Looking for a fun way to practice during the winter. I would encourage people to try simulator Golf. I would call this playing computer golf with a full set of clubs.

The player stands on an artificial tee. The golf hole is projected on the screen. The player swings the club, hits the ball towards the screen, the computer calculates the distance and trajectory of the shot, displays the information on the screen.

Based on the results of that shot, the player selects another club until he finishes the hole. It takes about four hours for a foursome to complete a round of golf.
